

New service delivers improvement in diabetes care

DIABETES patients have received a "dramatically improved" level of care since the launch of a service in Colchester and Tendring.

Over the past two years, 4,000 more patients are receiving the eight recommended health checks from

their GP. Figures from the Independent National Diabetes Audit show 50.5 per cent of people with Type 1 diabetes and 67.9 per cent of people with Type 2 are receiving all eight health checks, exceeding the national averages of 39.6 per cent and 59 per

cent respectively. The North East Essex Diabetes Service, launched in 2013, provides a specialist team that supports GP practices by providing more services in a local setting, reducing the need for hospital visits.

Patients are encouraged

to develop their awareness of diabetes and feel more in control of the condition.

The team is led by a consultant and community clinics are held in Clacton, Colchester and Harwich.
